Dear Family in Christ,



What a blessed season of Lent and Easter we had here at Faith Presbyterian Church. I couldn't begin to describe all of the meaningful events and details of the special services such as the Wednesday Lent services held in our chapel organized by Pastor Sheryl, or the Sunday services with themes of the season highlighted by special music by the choir, the bell choir, individual soloists, duets and trios. Many first-time visitors attended and expressed interest in our church for which we are grateful to God and we look forward to greeting more first-time visitors in the future. Hopefully, there will be a new member class sometime this summer.

Around 100 people attended the Maundy Thursday service which included the format of a Jewish Passover Seder and led into the meal Jesus and his disciples had before his death on the cross and the meaning of that meal for all Christians. Rod and Jane Coughlin provided the catered meal and served it with help from their son and grandchildren who had a few roles to play in the Seder meal.

Easter Sunday is always a very meaningful day of worship as it should be and even more so when many of our members were able to attend and stay for fellowship as well. Several members who aren't able to attend in person are viewing the worship services by way of livestream and that has been a tremendous addition to our church. Our thanks to Bill Hoskins and Paul Willemsen for making that possible Sunday after Sunday.

The meaning and power of Easter should remain with us all year. The Apostle Paul's letter to Corinthians was the earliest record in writing of spreading the good news of the resurrection of Jesus. Paul wrote: "For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Peter, and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, and last of all he appeared to me also."


The resurrection of Christ carried Christianity beyond the bounds of race, beyond the bounds of one tiny country.

The risen Christ gave his disciples invincible conviction, he gave them triumphant spirits, the risen Christ became their companions and transformed and glorified their lives. The risen Christ lives in the present offering his Spirit to face all kinds of life's transitions, joys and sorrows. Many of our members are going through times of grief and sadness, severe illnesses and worry about the future.

The good news is that Jesus promised to be with us always. There is hope in hopelessness. There is victory over suffering. The believers in Jesus that have already died, are not dead. They have vanished from our sight for a little while, but if the curtain could be withdrawn, every one of them would be seen to stand unharmed, crowned and victorious.

Another Easter Sunday has past but the spirit of Easter remains in us through the living Jesus Christ. We live in the power of Christ's resurrection from death. Let us be moved and inspired, comforted and emboldened to live like and for Jesus Christ. Let us live as those who are alive from the dead to die no more.

Faith Piecemakers

Faith Presbyterian has had a quilting group for a very long time, but it discontinued in 2020 as COVID restricted activities and the quilters became involved in other activities. The group was reformed once restrictions began to lift, and renamed itself the Faith Piecemakers. Since then a small group of talented quilters has made quilts and blankets for Habitat for Humanity (6), Auberge Memory Care Facility (24), the Navajo Christmas project (3), and the Surprise branch of Salvation Army (34). We also made table runners, place mats, napkins, wall hangings, mug rugs, microwave bowl covers and hand towels and sold them to the congregation during Advent and raised money for Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. In addition to our normal small quilting projects, we are currently making nap mats for the 3 and 4 year olds at the Pima Mission School and plan to have another sale in November to give congregational members a chance to purchase Christmas presents and decorations and to raise money for Faith charities. The quilting group includes Barbara Burnett, Sandra Baldwin, Becky Epperson, Ann Kennaly, Marsha Malsack, Pat Redden, Diane Lewis, Sue Bielman and Jan Dalai. We have been assisted by a number of other talented members of Faith who picked up quilt kits we had compiled and made quilts over the summers. The quilters continue to meet over the summer with members who are not traveling, and invite others to join us. It was a very successful and enjoyable event.





Summer Cinema, Congregational Life at Faith

2nd Thursdays of the months June through September, we will show movies in Illingworth Hall at 4pm, followed by a great summer meal by our regular caterers Jane & Rod. The movie is free—Tickets for the meal will be available at the Reception Desk during the week, and Sundays in the Narthex before and after worship for \$10.

- When your class or group plans to meet so that a room can be reserved for you and placed on the church calendar.
- When your home address, or phone number, or email changes so the church records can be amended.
- When you are planning to move - either out of town or locally.
- When you feel the church can assist you in any way.
