Dear Family in Christ,

"What is God leading us to be and do now in the place where we find ourselves?" These are the words of Rev. Joan Gray from her book Spiritual Leadership written in 2009. Despite the fact that Rev. Gray could not possibly foreseen the world we are living in today, have her words are timeless and have always been the question that Christians are faced with in any generation since Pentecost.

She pointed out that the experiences of Jesus centered around a boat are mentioned 50 times in the Gospels. The boats of Jesus' day on the Sea of Galilee were fitted for rowing and for sailing.

Rev Gray said that the leaders of the church, its pastors and officers make the crucial choices about how that congregation is going to go forward. They decide whether the church will operate like a rowboat or a sailboat. What she has say about both is meaningful and helpful in these days of pandemic, and various crisis in our country and in others as well. What is God leading us to be and do now in the place where we find ourselves? What does she mean by a row boat or sailboat church?

The rowboat church seeks to follow God and puts in time, talent and treasure to achieve the perceived direction of God's leading. All well and good. But the direction is based on circumstances like money, volunteers, the skill of its leaders, and the community in which the church is located. The key question is "What can we do with what we have?" The presence of resources largely determines what can or cannot be done. That seems logical and practical.

A sailboat church is one that relies on God who can do more than we can ask or imagine. The presence or lack of material resources is not the decisive factor in what the church can accomplish. "It is God NEW MEMBER CLASS who leads and empowers them to do more than SUNDAY FEBRUARY 20, 2022 they could ever have imagined. Decisions are made based on being willing to pray, study, confer together, and discern where God is moving and where God is inviting the church to invest themselves in God's work" says Rev Gray.

Prior to the temporary closing of our church in March, 2020, we were rowing and growing.

There was a great deal of confidence about the future as we assumed it would be based on the positive atmosphere of having faithful officers

members and being a warm, accepting and genuinely friendly congregation with meaningful worship, leadership of elders and deacons and the various programs offered to both church and community members. We were receiving new members on a frequent basis who were committing themselves to a new church home.

When the pandemic forced a major change upon the entire world, our assumptions about the future changed dramatically. What was going to happen to our church? Would we be able to survive the closing down of worship for several months? What was going to happen to our members who were considered the most vulnerable to the effects of Covid? In a metaphorical sense, we put down our oars and put up our sails. The God who called us into this church is also the God who provides and God has protected, provided and guided this church through the turbulent waters of an unknown future. We still have the same qualities of our church as before the pandemic in many ways, but I believe we are even stronger in faith because it was tested and we realized what matters most to us in this congregation and we have affirmed our confidence in one another and in God's provisions for the future.

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge the Lord and your paths will be made straight." Proverbs 3

From the Associate Pastor

Pastor Sheryl

Lenten Wednesdays 4pm, plus Morning Calls. Beginning March 2

Rev. Sheryl Campbell has planned a Lenten Series called "Prayer for Spiritual Stamina." M. Spoelstra is the author of several Bible studies including one on the life of Elijah, a prophet of Israel who boldly proclaimed God's messages and found spiritual stamina during the changing seasons of life. Pastor Sheryl has adapted Spoelstra's "Spiritual Stamina Prayer Guide" for the weeks of Lent.

Our sessions of worship and prayer will be in the Chapel building at Faith Presbyterian Church, 4 p.m. Wednesdays beginning with Ash Wednesday March 2. There is NOT a dinner on campus planned during this Lenten series.

The 4pm Spiritual Stamina worship and study will be finished each Wednesday by 4:45pm.

We then encourage each of you to make your own plans, **choosing whether you might:**

- Return to your home to dine as usual
- Make time to get together with one or more people—could be the same people each week, or different week by week. One could be your DNA (Designated Neighborhood Association—Deacons Group). One could be your Little Dinner Group. You may find someone you would like to get to know better. Or celebrate with someone you already know well. Restaurant, Someone's Home, Picnic, other?
- It IS Lent, after all—some may choose to fast, spend additional time in prayer, study, and/or service of some kind.

An additional feature of this series, offered at 8:45 a.m. every Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday beginning March 3, is the Spiritual Stamina Phone-In. At 8:45 a.m. those days, call (either with your cell phone, or long distance on your land line) the same number we have used for certain other studies and meetings over the past

couple of years: **774-267-7989** (use a 1 if you need to). Pastor Sheryl (and perhaps at times, others) will share each of those days a chapter from the Spiritual Stamina book. Just as we use different exercises to get our bodies in shape, we will explore using different prayer exercises to grow spiritually as we draw close to God in fresh ways.

Get ready to talk and listen to God with greater intentionality. "Let us run with endurance the race God has set before us. We do this by keeping our eyes on Jesus, the champion who initiates and perfects our faith" (Hebrews 12:1b-2).

Wednesday Lenten series is March 2 (Ash Wednesday), 9, 16, 23, 30, and April 6.

Gospel Song Devotional

Wednesday March 23, 4pm, we will host a special musical guest, Mr. Don Henry. We heard him sing a beautiful duet during Sunday worship in January with Anita Westbrook. Now he is returning to Faith Presbyterian to provide a special Gospel Song Devotional. We will hear songs and story in Don's wonderful baritone voice, bringing some tunes we know well, and some vintage pieces that put God's love in a new light. The March 23 devotional will be 1 hour long.



MAUNDY THURSDAY APRIL 14 at 6 p.m.

The Christian tradition of observing Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday, April 10. A Maundy Thursday service is planned for April 14, in which Christians observe Jesus' Last Supper during a Passover meal that occurred days before his death and resurrection. This year we respectfully include elements of the traditional Passover meal that recall the defining moment in Jewish history-the Exodus, that Jesus himself observed. We will follow elements of the ancient biblical order of worship highlighted by the festivity of worship, food, sacred joyous music and fellowship in a home like atmosphere.

You will be invited to taste some of the ritual foods that are used in Jewish homes for Passover as well as pray the prayers associated with Passover. We will also experience this evening through the eyes of the apostles as Jesus words "This is My body, this is My blood" have become words of eternal importance for Christians today that began at one particular Passover meal.

As is the custom at Passover meals, there will be a bounteous family style meal. Our caterer Jane Coughlin will provide the food. There will also be live and recorded music to enhance the evening intended to offer the utmost respect to this sacred Jewish tradition as well as providing depth and insight into the origins of the "Last Supper" in which Christians have and observe today as the "Lord's Supper." The service will begin promptly at 6pm in Illingworth Hall and end at 7:30. vations and tickets are needed for the caterer. The cost of the meal is \$10.00. Although not intended to be an evening of entertainment, Maundy Thursday will be an evening of worship, joyous celebration and reverence honoring the religious tradition of Jesus and being thankful for what Jesus has done and is doing for us and for the world as a result of his life, death and resurrection. Tuesday, December 14 came and with 3 SUV's & one pickup truck loaded down, the six of us (Priscilla & Bill Hoskins, Kathy & Greg Owens, Les &

Pat Redden and Debbie Young with a good friend Nancy Herrmann) set off for Holbrook to deliver all the good and gifts that poured in (with much love) from the "Giving Tree" donations.



The load included: 80 gift bags, 40 backpacks, bag of soccer balls, two tubs of school supplies, two tubs of personal hygiene products, 350+ "new" t-shirts and poloshirts, 20 + "new" sweat pants,

bag of handmade beanies, bag of handmade blankets, three large bags of art projects and supplies, 40 bottles of Gatorade, 40 bags of cookies and 40 bags of variety chips. Needless to say, the staff was over the moon with joy.

The parents were being very cautious and did not permit us to have any pictures or interactions with the children but the rumors were flying from classroom to classroom as we were busy carrying in all the donations. It seems our group of faith angels were spotted by a couple of the children who were on restroom break. The teachers told us the excitement was mounting. We had originally had each child fill out a wish/want list that we could go by. One teacher confessed to us that many of the children had had so many promises broken in their lives that they just assumed this would be another false promise. Boy did we ever restore their faith in humanity again. There was a nice lay out of lunchmeats and veggies for us as we talked and learned more about the school and the programs sponsored.

The weather was beginning to turn so we quickly began out departure but before we left, we were told by the staff that not only would we be giving hope to the lost and forgotten children there but we were providing supplies for the next 5 years to come.

Many, many, thanks to all who gave their time, money, supplies and/or gifts to these less fortunate children of Navajo County School. Hope, faith and the magic of Christmas has at least been restored or renewed in these children's eyes and will most

likely be remembered for the rest of their lives. Please stop by and check out the easel in the Narthex that have thank you notes from the staff and a few of the children.
