A Litany of Faith

Rev. Dr. David Hodgson and Choir

[A liturgical conversation between *Brief Statement of Faith* #326 and *Spirit of God, Descend Upon My Heart.*]

Pastor: In life and in death we belong to God.... We trust in God the Holy Spirit,

everywhere the giver and renewer of life.

Choir: Spirit of God, descend upon my heart;

Wean it from earth; through all its pulses move. Stoop to my weakness, mighty as Thou art, And make me love Thee as I ought to love.

Pastor: The same Spirit who inspired the prophets and apostles rules our faith

and life in Christ through Scripture, engages us through the Word proclaimed, claims us in the waters of baptism, feeds us with the bread

of life and the cup of salvation, and calls women and men to all
