

# Dear Members and Friends of Faith Presbyterian,

I address you as "friends," much as Jesus did in a scene described by one pastor as he wrote an introduction to the sacrament of Communion:

"On a different night, under a different set of stars, that same child, now grown and at the other end of his life, gathered his <u>friends</u> and they shared a meal. On that night, Jesus took the bread, and after giving thanks to God, he broke it and gave it to the disciples saying, 'Take, eat. This is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." The "different set of stars" refers back to the visit by the Magi and the star which they followed, and the Magi visit marks the end of the Christmas and brings us to the new year.

Happy New Year! ... now a quarter of the way into the 21<sup>st</sup> century. That seems impossible! Weren't we just worrying about Y2K and the turn of the century. 9-11 does not seem like such a distant memory. But here we are, together,

embracing a new year that will surely bring blessings ... along with change - blessings and change in our own lives and that of the church.

After a period of study and getting to know one another, our visioning process will result in several interesting ideas for change (I firmly believe). "Change" is in reaction to the way the world is changing around us. Our church only goes back 50 years, not much in terms of the life of the greater church. Yet the 1970's, which most of us remember well, was a vastly different cultural and religious scene. So be it. Every type of organization has needed to adapt and church is not exempt.

The key question is, "What would God have us do in this place and time?" The vast majority of American denominational churches are asking the same – and maybe it is time we talk with one another, as the best answer is likely greater than what any one church can devise.

Whether or not you participate on the Visioning Team which kicks-off this week (January 10 at 10:00 AM), be sure to relay your thoughts, ideas and even dreams, to me or the Long-Range Planning Committee that is guiding this process: Maria Sinley, Dana Kovach and Sandra Baldwin.

My wife Anne and I thank you for all of the Christmas generosity extended to us. We could not have known what the change would feel like coming from Tennessee to Arizona. But you have made us feel good, and we feel good about the church and our new friends in Christ.




