Dear Members and Friends of Faith Presbyterian,

The month of May has been a mixed bag. Many of our snowbirds have flown north or east and, while I am happy for them, they will be missed. Hopefully you stay in touch through our streaming service and the ability to Zoom into committee and Session meetings.

May also brought the wedding of our Office Manager, MaryJo Steger, and the love and joy that encircled that event here at Faith. The Vision Team also presented architectural renderings to the congregation, sharing a visual impression of what the church may choose to pursue in its expansion and partnerships. Further meetings will be scheduled for Q&A, discussion and more information about how such a multifaceted ministry might operate – partners, financing, management and so on. We have a number of outside speakers that can share their perspective on our vision.

In short, the Vision Team continues to favor the creation of a multi-faith, multi-functional campus, to include a retreat center (perhaps 40 hotel rooms),

facilities open to the public for food, coffee, walking, etc., and the housing of a number of different congregations. These could potentially include Catholic, Jewish and an expanded Protestant presence. All of these possibilities remain open, as well as other tactics, such as mergers or sharing property. Any such significant changes would come before the congregation and Presbytery for discussion and approval. In the meantime, the Vision Team will continue to pursue discussions with outside parties as potential partners and or financiers.

We will also be putting together a video that can be played with a simple link that will describe the mission of the church and the animated renderings of an expanded campus. So, lots of work ahead, but all in the name of connecting with our neighbors in new and innovative ways. Included here is a depiction of a new entrance to the campus on Del Webb Boulevard across from Burns Drive.

Thank you for your prayers and patience as we move forward together.

Getting to Know You....

Who would like to be next to share their life story?

Iris DePasquale Life Story

When Pastor Greg asked me to write my story I really hesitated because my life has been very different than most.

I remember the day I got my GED certificate; I was probably more excited than some are when they get a master's degree. I was in my mid 40's and could finally say I had more than a level grade 9 education.

I was born 1941 in a very rural Alberta, Canada area. My mom was an RN, and my dad was a farmer. We did not have electricity or running water unless we pumped water and ran back up to the house with our pails.

I have an older brother who is still living, and a twin sister and a younger sister who are deceased. Life was good despite my dad being disabled from painful arthritis when I was very young.

We grew up in a happy Christian home and did not know we did not have much because we had lots of love and care. I started school in a one room country school, getting there with horse and buggy or small sleigh in the winter for the first four years and were then bussed to school.

I did well but it was not for me. I dropped out in the middle of grade 10 and married a local farmer that spring. We had 7 children in 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ years, yes, we were busy but loved it all, 4 girls and 3 boys, 2 of which were adopted.

We were very active in the local church volunteering where we could, and I taught Sunday School for years. I worked inside the house, outside had a large garden sewed most of the kid's clothes and baked 20 loaves of bread at a time. I trucked grain in harvest, stacked bales and helped deliver calves whenever needed. I enjoyed doing that but not so much when it was time to butcher the chickens in the fall. It became my job to chop off their heads. I decided they did not know it was me or someone else, so "Just do it" and I did it.

I got interested in Brownie's, Guides, and Pathfinders (the equivalent to Girl Scouts in the U.S.) got my license as camp cook, camp director, and guider in charge. I loved it all. We camped in a very wilderness camp in the middle of nowhere without water, electricity, or phones. We even camped one winter in 28 below weather. We all had fun

and survived without casualties.

The kids were growing up, one worked on the farm, one got married, another went off to a university. We then decided to take the younger 3 and move to Phoenix for the winter. The boys did not stay long, and my husband went back to the farm while my youngest daughter and I stayed.

I was divorced and wanted my green card, so I asked someone to marry me temporarily. Well, that marriage lasted almost 30 good years. I acquired a wonderful stepfamily so now I have 10 kids between us and several grandchildren.

I became interested in lots of new things. I cleaned houses for a while and then started working in a handmade paper shop. I learned how to make handmade paper from allnatural fibers. I took some book binding classes and was hooked. I made and sold a lot of handmade books and specialty boxes and taught book binding for several years. We moved to Sun City June of 2000, so I let that all go.

I was diagnosed with cancer a few months later and lost my oldest stepdaughter the next year.

Life went on.

I started pottery classes and loved it. China painting was my favorite. After that I started making quilts and still do some of that today. I also joined a chair yoga class which I still do and love today.

I joined Faith Church in 2008 and became very involved and made new and wonderful lasting friends.

After years of poor health my husband passed in 2015. I also lost my youngest son and oldest daughter in 2018, my younger sister in 2019, my twin sister in 2020, step granddaughter in 2021, then 4 nieces and a brother-in-law. Recently I lost my sister-in-law. I would not have survived without my faith, church family and friends. I have learned to put one foot in front of the other knowing God is always with me to get me through. I am very thankful.

I still have 7 great kids, 21 wonderful grandchildren and soon to be 27 great grandchildren. All so precious and special in their own way.

Michael came into my life a few years ago and then Tara, his little miniature dachshund, they are both such a blessing. Our favorite thing to do is go camping in our trailer.
